



# CMVL SCORE TABLE

## QUICK REFERENCE RULE SHEET

*CMVL has a few non-standard volleyball rules, this is just a help sheet for Referees, scorekeepers and coaches*

### BEHAVIOR

Head Coaches will bear responsibility for everyone present who is associated with their team. NO PLAYER, COACH, PARENT, OR SPECTATOR MAY HARASS, INTERFERE WITH THEIR ABILITY TO CARRY OUT THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES, OR DISAGREE WITH A REFEREE or SCOREKEEPER

### COACHES

Only one coach is permitted to stand during games and should remain off the court during play.

### MINIMUM NUMBERS OF PLAYERS

Can start with five (5) players and a "ghost player."

### TIME OUTS

Each team is allowed two (2) 45 second time-outs per set. Only a coach or team captain may notify the official of a time-out.

### CHALLENGES

Each team is entitled to **ONE (1) Challenge per game**. Only Head Coaches can request a challenge presenting a green card or display a "C" hand signal to the scorekeeper. Upon notification from the scorekeeper, the referee shall come down to conduct a review of the specific rule with the Head Coaches. Only substitutions and grade specific rules can be challenged. Other referee's calls like (Ball In/Out, Touched ball, Net Faults, Antenna Touches, Foot Faults, Out of rotation, etc.) cannot be challenged. If the Challenge is successful the team will retain their challenge.

### SUBSTITUTION RULES IF MORE THAN 12 PLAYERS

If a team has more than 12 players at a game, NO players are allowed to play more than two halves of a set.

If a team has **13 players** at a game, 11 of them will play one full set, and 2 of them will play one half of a set each.

If a team has **14 players** at a game, 10 of them will play one full set, and 4 of them will play one half of a set each.

If a team has **15 players** at a game, 9 of them will play one full set, and 6 of them will play one half of a set each.

### CHARITABLE PLAY

Coaches will be aware of the score at all times and will actively refrain from "running it CMVL League Rules Updated: 05-28-15 up". Score of 25-2 and 15-1 weaken our league and have a negative effect. Coaches are expected to educate their players on respecting their opponents and set the example for how to win and lose with both class and dignity





### 5th/6th Grade Division

- Players may serve up to three (3) consecutive times from a line 5' in front of the end line (line must be clearly marked across the entire court).
- When a server makes her three (3) first consecutive serves, beginning the 4th serve, that player must move back to the actual service line to continue serving.
- If a server makes a total of five (5) consecutive serves, at the end of the play, regardless which team scores the point, a side-out will be called, with the service moving to the opponent team.
- A server may have one re-serve per serve. (A re-serve is called when the server drops the ball, tosses the ball in the air and drops it, or tosses it in the air and catches it.)
- When serving, a server shall be allowed up to ten (10) seconds to complete her serve once the whistle is blown by the referee.
- The 3rd set of the match may be played provided that both teams' coaches agree and the set will not cause subsequent match start times to be delayed.
- A "lite" volleyball will be used for this age group.
- **NO SUBSTITUTIONS** may occur between players in the first or second set of the game. Except when a team has more than 12 players

### 7th/8th Grade Division

- **NO SUBSTITUTIONS** are permitted before 12th point in first or second set of the game
- At point 12 either coach may substitute a maximum of 3 PLAYERS
- After the 12th point, absolutely NO SUBSTITUTIONS may occur on either team unless for illness/injury
- If a 3rd set is needed, free substitutions can be made by both teams during this set without a maximum set
